These four men of God helped their fellow soldiers board lifeboats and when they ran out of life jackets they each gave up their life jacket. Their final act of love and bravery was that they joined arms, and prayed and sang hymns as they went down with the ship. They showed the great act of loving your fellow man. They were awarded the Distinguished Service Cross and The Purple Heart.
